



Refurbishment of existing buildings

Just how much quality **KEMPEROL** products deliver in addition to simple processing is also and especially proven in the context of special challenges. In early summer 2019, these challenges included the waterproofing of various elements of the castle in the district of Verden: Etelsen Castle. The historic building was built between 1885 and 1887 in neo-Renaissance architecture. Originally built by the von Heimbruch brothers to replace an older manor house, the structure has been owned by the district of Verden since the early 1980s and is used as a conference hotel by the Bildungswerk der Niedersächsischen Wirtschaft (BNW).

At first glance, the brick masonry framed by house-stone articulations catches the eye. On closer inspection, however, it is above all the details in the area of the roof that play a characteristic role. It was precisely here, in May of this year, that a refurbishment of the existing metal roofs, dormers and gutters was required after

being commissioned by the district of Verden. And with it a reliable, safe and proven product for waterproofing. The substrate: metal, without primer. In the course of this, **KEMPER SYSTEM** Partner Püllmann Dachbau renovated a total of 20 dormers of 2 m² each, as well as numerous connections and coverings.
